

OCEANSIDE VILLAGE ANNUAL YARD SALE









The Third Annual Senior Prom




December's project provided 66 stuffed stockings for the residents of Garden City Nursing Home. OSV neighbors donated items including hygiene products, tissues, calendars, game books, pens, pencils and candies. There were huge smiles from the recipients at their Christmas party.



February is recognized as Pediatric Cancer Awareness month by Lions International. South Strand Lions discovered Happy Wheels, a program at Jenkins Children's Hospital at the Medical University of SC (MUSC). Happy Wheels, a cart filled with toys, books, puzzles and games, visits each pediatric patient each week for a selection to enjoy and keep. These gifts provide some HAPPY in the hospital and a pleasant memory at home. Again, OSV neighbors and the OSV Golf Group have been amazingly generous. One donor was moved to give because her son, who is now 50 and a firefighter, was a pediatric cancer patient.
