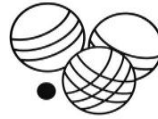

**Can You Power Wash a House in the Winter?**

Most people love the look of their home after it is freshly power washed. It looks so shiny and new again! Plus, it's pretty satisfying to watch all that dirt, grime, and build-up just fall away and wash down into the street gutter. But many homeowners also wonder if their homes can be power washed in the winter. Whether you've procrastinated the task or were gone all summer and didn't have time to schedule it, you can still power wash a house in the winter.



To an extent, yes. It's not the best idea to power wash when the outside temperature is below 40 degrees. Cold temps like this can damage the pumps, cause the water to freeze as it is sprayed onto your home, and just makes for less effective cleaning in general. Typically, don't power wash your home if the temperature is too cold. The day may start at 20 degrees but warm up to 45 by the afternoon.

You can power wash later in the day when it's warmer outside.
